Public Education Forums: Overview and Schedule

Overview

Trenton Water Works’ (TWW) Public Education Forums are designed to encourage attendees—residents, customers, and public officials—to ask questions about their drinking water and water utility infrastructure and get information directly from TWW representatives. The two-hour Q&A sessions feature a variety of experts providing information on the science of water treatment, lead in drinking water and localized sources of lead, the water utility’s corrosion-control strategy, its **Lead Service Line Replacement Program** to replace residential lead lines with safer copper lines, and the importance of utility mark-outs that identify underground utilities (i.e. New Jersey One Call and Call Before You Dig). Residents attending the forums will have access to a GIS mapping table to determine if a lead service line exists on their property. Attendees will also be able to sign up to receive alerts from the **TWW-Connects Water Quality Information System**.

About Trenton Water Works

TWW is among the largest publicly owned, urban water utilities in the United States. It supplies an average of 27 million gallons of Delaware River-sourced drinking water per day to 63,000 metered customers. It services approximately 225,000 people in Trenton, parts of Hamilton Township, Ewing Township, Lawrence Township and Hopewell Township in Mercer County, New Jersey. Established more than 200 years ago, TWW has some 120 employees who operate a 60-million-gallon water-filtration plant and water-distribution system that includes a 100-million-gallon reservoir. The system has 683 miles of water mains varying in size from 4 to 48 inches in diameter, three pump stations, and six interconnections between TWW and other water purveyors.
