Public Health Advisory

We have recently been advised by the State of New Jersey, Department of Health, Division of Animal Health, that blood tests on a skunk in our area has tested positive for Distemper. We are advising residents to do the following:

- Stay Away! Do not come in close contact with the animal.
- If your dog has not been vaccinated, keep it inside and vaccinate immediately.
- Distemper cannot be transmitted to humans, but humans can become a host for the disease if they come in close contact.
- Get your dogs vaccinated to avoid it contracting the disease. The disease can be found in skunk fecal droppings and saliva.
- The City of Trenton Humane Law Enforcement Bureau does not have to capture a skunk displaying this behavior, except if someone has come in actual contact with the skunk (bite/scratch), or if the animal is in an area where there is a crowd of people.
- If none of those exceptions are present, AVOID, STAY AWAY, AND ALLOW IT TO PASS THROUGH.
