## **Trenton Mayor Eric E. Jackson Declares State of Emergency**

On Saturday morning at 9:28 a.m., following nearly a foot of snow accumulation with a forecast promising another several inches, Trenton Mayor Eric Jackson declared a State of Emergency in the city of Trenton.

"All vehicular traffic—with the exception of emergency vehicles, fuel oil deliveries, nonprofit meal and medical supply deliveries—is prohibited on city streets until the Emergency has been lifted," said Mayor Jackson.

Snow-removal operations, involving more than two-dozen trucks plowing main thoroughfares and streets around city hospitals and nursing homes, are well underway. Residents along snow-removal routes must move their parked cars to school lots. The Trenton Police Department is actively towing vehicles that have not complied with earlier instructions.

At this time, no power outages have been reported. The Mayor has activated the emergency operations center at Fire and Emergency Service headquarters on Perry Street, and he and members of his leadership team continue to monitor the situation. Residents are asked to remain indoors and to check on elderly neighbors, when possible.
