Winter Advisory from Trenton Mayor Eric E. Jackson

The severe winter weather expected for this evening and through the weekend poses a danger to city residents. Mayor Eric Jackson's office continues to monitor predictions on the storm's severity and will adjust our action plan as needed. I am urging all of you to stay home and off the roads on Friday night, Saturday and Sunday, particularly as state, county and Trenton municipal governments engage in snow-removal operations. It is important for you to remove your car from snow-removal routes. Information on these routes is at trentonnj.org.

A few housekeeping and safety priorities:

- There is no trash collection on Saturday.
- Please bring your pets indoors and be careful not to overexert yourself when shoveling snow.
- Check on your elderly friends and neighbors.
- Do not use the oven or kerosene heat as sources of heat.
- Do not use a space heater indoors that requires combustible fuel.

If you are a tenant with no heat and your landlord will not respond to your requests for help, call (609) 989-3560 to leave a message. An inspector from the city's Department of Inspections will return your call.

If you need emergency assistance, dial 911. If you require non-emergency assistance, call (609) 989-4170. The city will use its "Emergency Broadcast System" as needed to convey important information to residents who have signed up to receive messages from the system.

If you experience a power outage, call PSE&G at 1-800-436-PSEG.

Remember, be kind and considerate to your neighbors and, if you are able, lend a helping hand. We will survive this blizzard together!
