Mr. Bethea requested clarity on 15-795. Mr. McEwen explained that the COT has been filling vacant positions through the use of temporary services. The NJ State Co-Op is available to the COT to utilize services to fill temporary positions. The COT will compensate the vendor who will pay the employee and the resolution will offer uniform control of the provider. The total includes payment to the company and for the employees up to that amount. Information on the number of positions to be filled, length of time and status on permanent placement was requested. Mr. McEwen estimated that the contract could run over one year. He noted that through this use any department requiring a temp will be able to have that position filled.

Mr. Chester announced that on Thursday, January 7, 2016, representatives of the Trenton Board of Education will present to answer question specific to the three bond ordinances.

Mr. Bethea asked for more details on this acquisition. Diana Rogers, Acting Director for H&ED explained that the properties are located across from the TFD headquarters next to Roberto Clemente Park. Ms. Rogers explained factors that determine the purchase price of the property. Mr. Bethea commented on the lack of advertisement which impedes purchasing opportunities by the community. Sold at market rate the property will be redeveloped for housing.

Public Hearing and 2nd Reading for Ordinances 15-41, 15-42, 15-43 will be held on January 21, 2016.

CIVIC COMMENT

Mr. Bethea again reiterated his opposition to the building and subsequent opening of a McDonald's franchise across the street from the high school on Chambers Street and has concerns relative to the acquisition/approval process. He will be forthcoming with a complaint.

Mr. Muschal questioned why street sweepers in the garage not in service. Residents complain constantly about the lack of street sweeper service and streets being filthy. He is frustrated with the number used TVs sitting curbside throughout the South Ward and wants Public Works to address the concern. He mentioned that Hawks Towing has offered to pick up tires for recycling but needs to coordinate with City for locations. Mr. Muschal stated that more trashcans are OK but if they aren't emptied in a timely manner, the problem remains.

Mr. Harrison extended a thank you to Mayor Jackson and PW Department for their assistance in the installation of 50 trash receptacles throughout the city in an effort to reduce littering.

Ms. Caldwell-Wilson expressed concern about garbage pickup and the lack of lighting for over two years on Market Street that is threatening, led to incidents and has remained in this condition for over two years. She reported that the apartments above Amoroso Florist on South Board Street are being

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renovated illegally without a permit. She called for an on call weekend evening inspections detail to address this issue. Ms. Caldwell-Wilson requested an update on Antigua Square on Clinton Avenue. Ms. Rogers reported that an environmental investigation is taking place along with a cleanup.

Ms. Reynolds-Jackson spoke about repeated complaints from a Quinton Avenue resident regarding suspicious activity in a neighborhood garage and presented a letter from said resident after no action was taken by the city. Ms. Reynolds-Jackson also addressed numerous concerns about properties throughout the East Ward that included: Complaints of lack of street sweeping and signage, and an unmet request to trim area trees. The Infinity Lounge continues to be reported as a nuisance. 136 Butler Street has been reported as an illegal boarding home. Ms. Blanco will provide updates. Ms. Reynolds-Jackson called for formation of a Parking Committee to address COT parking issues. Ms. Caldwell-Wilson stated that there is a Parking Committee that has not met recently but had been addressing various issues that impact parking in the COT.

Mr. Chester announced meeting date changes which included the January 13 ABC meeting being cancelled, the January 14 Budget Hearing rescheduled to January 26; and newly scheduled Jan 12 Interview with Council Aide applicant.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Darryl Brooks – Encouraged everyone to vote for Donald Trump.

Billie Hayes – Expressed concern with the school bond ordinances 15-42, 15-43, due to the lack of information and use of language that is too broad. He would like the distributions to be defined and mentioned the example of a listed allocation for Trenton Community School which he is unfamiliar with. He was disturbed that action was being taken by Council without specific estimates or at least three comparisons. Mr. Hayes was aware of the district classifications and cited various examples that the State of New Jersey can and should be paying for instead of the COT. He does not support these ordinances and called for new policy implementations regarding issuance of COT bonds.

Motion to close Public Comment made by Mr. Bethea; seconded by Ms. Reynolds-Jackson. All in Favor. Aye.




