IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE TRENTON POLICE DEPARTMENT

Due to the evolving situation concerning Covid-19, The Trenton Police Department is taking the following protective measures to help safeguard the health and welfare of the Public, our Officers and staff. In order to continue to provide the best public safety services possible we are asking the following:

1. Whenever possible utilize Telephonic Reporting by calling our non-emergency number at (609) 989-4000.
2. If you have to come to Trenton Police Headquarters we will greet you from behind our glass partition and will conduct business from behind same. If there is paperwork that needs to be exchanged, it will be through the slot in the window. This will include all Records Bureau requests and necessary release paperwork for towed vehicles.
3. If you have had a fever or any other associated symptoms of Covid-19, please DO NOT come into our Headquarters UNLESS IT IS AN EMERGENCY! We are strongly encouraging the use of Phone Call reporting if at all possible.
4. Beginning Monday March 16, 2020 the police department is suspending all fingerprinting for the next thirty (30) days except for mandatory fingerprinting following an arrest.
5. Also beginning on Monday March 16, 2020 for the next thirty (30) days we will not be hosting tours or conducting community meetings at Trenton Police Headquarters or any other police buildings including the East and West District Buildings. Additionally, we will be limiting our frequency of attending non emergent events. Moreover our Citizens Academy will be temporarily suspended during this time of health concern.
6. Although greatly appreciated, we respectfully request that you do not come to Trenton Police Headquarters for this thirty (30) day period to visit us for well-wishing or any other gesture of kindness.

Police Director Sheilah A. Coley wants to reassure everyone that the Trenton Police Department will still provide our community with the very best and professional service while we are taking these measures to protect the public, our officers and staff. The decision to institute these measures was not taken lightly and the Trenton Police Department is committed to continue to answer any and all emergent calls for service with the same high level of professionalism and courtesy as we always have. Although instituting these precautionary measures may seem unfriendly and unwelcoming to some, we are here to serve all and must take these measures to ensure that we can continue to provide emergency service and response to the public when needed.
