2022 CDBG Proposed Use of Funds:

CDBG Proposed Use of Funds:

- Administration: \$576,057
- Senior Center Operations: \$250,000
- City Park Improvements: \$300,000
- First-Time Homebuyer: \$200,000
- Public Facilities Improvements: \$1,054,228
- Housing Rehabilitation: \$500,000



2022 HOME Proposed Use of Funds:

Housing Programs – provide safe and decent housing for low- and moderate-income households.

- Administration: \$103,057
- HOME Project: \$772,927
- CHDO Set-aside: \$154,585



2022 ESG Proposed Use of Funds:

- Administration: \$9,759
- ESG Homeless Activities: \$250,477

City will provide applicants funding for homeless prevention activities and services related to assisting and or reducing homelessness: (1) engage homeless individuals and families living on the street; (2) improve the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals and families; (3) help operate these shelters; (4) provide essential services to shelter residents, and (5) prevent families/individuals from becoming homeless. assistance for. The ESG program will provide assistance directly to those agencies associated with the helping the homeless persons living in the city including but not limited to: Emergency Shelters, Street Outreach, Homelessness Prevention, HMIS system support, and funding to city staff for administration of the ESG Program.
